Evidence of school performance

<p>Key statements from Ofsted report(s) relating to the performance of disadvantaged pupils:</p>	<p>The proportion of students known to be eligible for the pupil premium is well-above average. (The pupil premium is additional funding for those students who are known to be eligible for free school meals, children from service families and those children that are looked after.)</p> <p>Students join the school with skills that are generally well-below those normally expected.</p> <p>Students who are known to be eligible for the pupil premium and students who are disabled or with special educational needs also make good progress and achieve well because of the highly effective care, guidance and support that the school provides for them.</p> <p>Students known to be eligible for free school meals achieve well. Their attainment is above that of similar students nationally. In comparison to other students in the school they attain on average approximately one quarter of a GCSE grade lower. The attainment gap in English and mathematics with students who are not known to be eligible for free school meals has closed rapidly in recent years and shows the school's effective commitment to providing equality of opportunity.</p>
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School's pupil premium statement

Stretford High School is committed to providing effective resources and ensuring vital support is in place for our Pupil Premium students in order to improve their academic achievement. Our key objectives using the Pupil Premium funding are to close the achievement and progress gap between eligible students and their peers. National trends indicate a 27% gap in achievement of 5 A*-C including English and Maths between non Pupil Premium and Pupil Premium students, validated data at Stretford High School puts our gap at 25% (22 students). Our aim is to close the gap in the rate of progress between disadvantaged students and other students, particularly middle ability pupils, boys and higher achieving students.

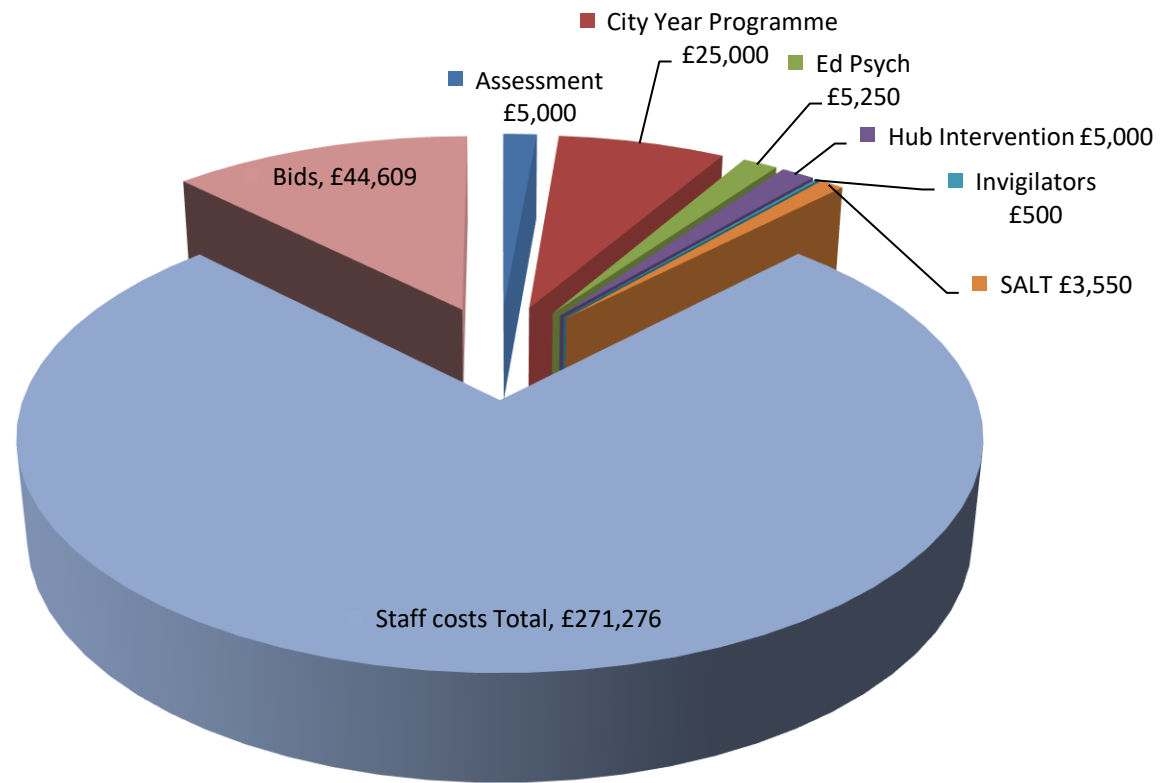

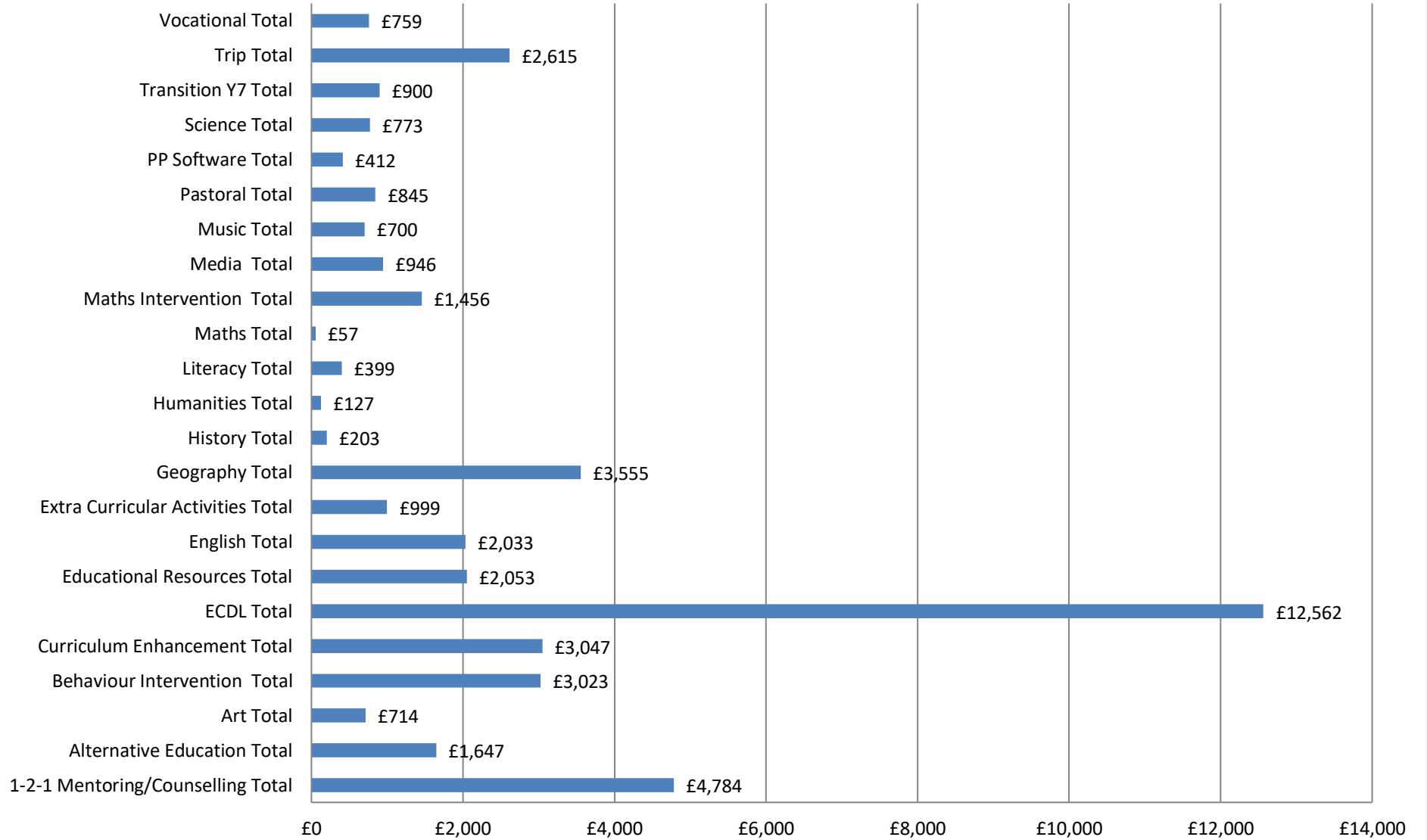

The analysis of all measures except those in English indicate the gap between PP and NPP students was widening in terms of both achievement and progress measures. The new leadership of data and an introduction of a streamlined and robust data entry have addressed this for 2015-16.

Progress 8 as a measure in 2015/2016 meant that our set of results for Y11 show that Pupil Premium students are outperforming their Non Pupil Premium peers:

- Progress 8 PP -0.27
 - Progress 8 NPP -0.42
 - Progress 8 English Language PP -0.44
 - Progress 8 English NPP -0.58
 - Progress 8 Maths PP -0.39
 - Progress 8 Maths NPP -0.32
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- English Language achieved 58% A*-C which is 7% below NA A*-C 2016 (65%). NPP students 79% performed better than PP 66% however PP students performed better than PP students nationally (51%) and the Stretford NPP to PP gap of -13% is less than the -22% national gap of NPP (73%) to PP (51%). There is -7% gap between Stretford PP and NA NPP. This was -32% in 2014/15.
 - Maths achieved 56% A*-C which is 15% below NA A*-C 2016 (71%). NPP students 66% performed better than PP 46% however PP students did not perform better than PP students nationally (49%) and the Stretford NPP to PP gap of -20% is slightly less than the -25% national gap of NPP (74%) to PP (49%). There is -3% gap between Stretford PP and NA NPP. This was -38% in 2014/15.
 - Science achieved 47% A*-C which is 17% below NA A*-C 2016 (64%). Although NPP (57%) performed better than PP (51%), PP students did not perform as well as PP students nationally (53%) however the Stretford NPP to PP gap of 6% is less than the -20% national gap of NPP (73%) to PP (53%). There is a -22% gap between Stretford PP and National Average NPP. This was -18% in 2010/15.

- Humanities achieved 57% A*-C which is 10% below NA A*-C 2015 (67%). Although NPP (64%) performed better than PP (51%), PP students are performing better than PP students nationally (49%) and the Stretford NPP to PP gap of -13% is less than the -22% national gap of NPP (71%) to PP (49%). There is a -20% gap between Stretford PP and National Average NPP. This was -32% in 2014/15.
- Languages achieved 69% A*-C which is 1% below NA A*-C 2015 (70%). Although NPP (72%) performed better than PP students (65%), PP students performed better than PP students nationally (59%). The Stretford NPP to PP gap of -7% is significantly less than the -22% national gap of NPP (71%) to PP (49%). There is a -6% gap between Stretford PP and National Average NPP. This was +16% in 2014/15.

Progress 8

- PP Progress 8 score is -0.27 compared to NPP -0.42 with an average of -0.28 for all, an increase on the 2015 Progress 8 score of -0.38.

Years 7-10

The latest data for Y7, 8 and 9 (July 2016) suggests that the achievement gap between Pupil Premium students and Non Pupil Premium students is much narrower. This is where our resources have been targeted in the main and the timescales involved will doubtless facilitate a more significant impact for future GCSE cohorts.
